

# Barcelona Expat Week: the meeting point for Barcelona's international community

The week of **19 to 23 October 2020** saw the first edition of **Barcelona Expat Week**, a hybrid, digital and face-to-face event that drew in over **2,600 people** becoming Barcelona's largest international gathering of the year.

The event was held on **a cooperative and innovative virtual platform** which played host to 34 digital activities and, what is more, served to provide other useful resources, encourage contacts and share knowledge.

Being a fair aimed at Barcelona's international community, Barcelona Expat Week represented a step forward from its predecessor, the Barcelona International Community Day (BICD), in **bringing together and highlighting international talent.** 

As part of the 'Barcelona, City of Talent' government measure by Barcelona City Council, this initiative positions Barcelona as an open city which attracts, welcomes and looks after international talent.










Audio advertisement broadcast on media popular among the target audience
